CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 20th, 1926

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 20th, 1926 show a net decrease of 3,644,248 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 22,267,924 bushels; Oats 7,665,551 bushels; Barley 3,743,931 bushels; Flax 2,272,694 bushels and Rye 2,043,097 bushels, a total of 37,993,197 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,542,639 bushels; Oats 201,236 bushels and Flax 252,260 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 165,422 and 156,465 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 125,049 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 62,566 bushels; Oats 71,336 bushels; Barley 613 bushels and Flax 3,779 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 13,245 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- A decrease is shown in the total grain of 27,556 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 3,824 bushels; Oats 19,128 bushels; Barley 3,190 and Rye 1,414 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a net increase of 17 bushels. An increase of 11,624 bushels is noted in Wheat, while Oats show a decrease of 11,607 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,266,140 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,809,946 bushels; Oats 211,784 bushels; Barley 113,511 and Flax 192,314 bushels, while an increase of 61,415 bushels is noted in Rye.
