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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 25, 1927.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 25th, 1927 show a net increase of 1,010,635 bushels over the previous week. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 120,443,978; Oats 15,017,573; Barley 11,800,406; Flaxseed 3,651,440; Rye 4,978,596; a total of 155,891,993 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,276,170 and Flaxseed 8,902 bushels while decreases are noted in Oats of 31,035; Barley 72,819 and Rye 170,583 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - An increase is shown, the grain stocks of 531,109 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 377,188; Oats 127,178; Barley 3,917; Flaxseed 9,596 and Rye 13,230 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on February 18th, 1927, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1926.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 268,741 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 249,227; Oats 12,312; Barley 8,184 bushels, while decreases are shown in Flaxseed and Rye of 18 and 964 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. Grain stocks show a net increase of 124,700 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 125,520 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 820 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,242,385 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,198,218; Barley 77,301; Flaxseed 2,878 and Rye 1,310,328 bushels respectively, while Oats show a decrease of 67,343 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS. - A net increase is noted in the grain stocks of 512,408 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 314,071; Oats 169,056 and Barley 31,848; while Flax and Rye show decreases of 2,080 and 487 bushels respectively.



PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S.GRAIN). - The U.S. grain stocks in Canada show a net increase of 2,284,744 bushels over the previous year. Increases are noted in Barley of 6,168 bushels; Rye 1,214,209 bushels and Corn 1,452,444 bushels, while Wheat and Oats show decreases of 34,900 bushels and 353,177 bushels respectively.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. - Canadian grain stocks show a net decrease of 617,719 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 532,437 bushels; Oats 17,503 bushels; Barley 66,693 bushels and Flax 1,474 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 388 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. - Canadian grain stocks show a net decrease of 39,580 bushels. Decreases are noted in Oats of 16,630 bushels; Barley 14,655 bushels and Rye 35,240 bushels, while Wheat shows an increase of 26,945 bushels.



DULUTH.- Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth by rail during the week ended February 26th, 1927, were as follows:- Wheat 3,975 bushels; Barley 1,523 bushels; Flaxseed 1,281 bushels. There was one shipment by rail of flaxseed amounting to 2,755 bushels during the week.

For the period from August 1st, 1926, to February 26th, 1927, the receipts by rail at Duluth were as follows:- Wheat 1,052,896 bushels; Oats 70,695 bushels; Barley 655,204 bushels; Rye 79,124 bushels and Flaxseed 80,447 bushels. Lake receipts amounted to 16,700 bushels. The shipments by lake were as follows:- Wheat 807,339 bushels; Oats 95,020 bushels; Barley 539,995 bushels; Flaxseed 36,114 bushels; Rye 69,553 bushels; a total of 1,547,911 bushels. The rail shipments were Wheat 54,315 bushels; Barley 68,752 bushels; Flaxseed 11,232 bushels and Rye 7,895 bushels.

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




