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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 4, 1927

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 4, 1927, show a decrease of 5,018,721 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 115,728,723 bushels; Oats 15,006,362 bushels; Barley 11,734,473 bushels; Flax 3,442,564 bushels; Rye 4,961,150 bushels, a total of 150,873,272 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the grains made up as follows:- Wheat 4,715,255 bushels; Oats 11,211 bushels; Barley 65,933 bushels; Flax 208,876 bushels; Rye 17,446 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - An increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 541,269 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 358,347 bushels; Oats 147,113 bushels; Barley 12,341 bushels; Flax 1,106 bushels; Rye 12,362 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 192,470 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 185,727 bushels and Oats 13,386 bushels, while Barley and Flax show increases of 4,760 and 1,883 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER AND PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these ports show a net decrease of 275,503 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 279,190 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 913 and 2,774 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 47,851 bushels. Increases are shown in Barley of 161,777 bushels and Rye 27,952 bushels, while decreases are noted in Wheat of 59,463 bushels; Oats 79,564 bushels, and Flaxseed 2,851 bushels.
