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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 27th, 1926

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 27th, 1926 show a net decrease of 3,727,346 bushels from the previous week.. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 18,896,391 bushels; Oats 7,732,177 bushels; Barley 3,268,771 bushels; Flax 2,178,662 bushels; Rye 2,189,850 bushels, a total of 34,265,851 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,371,533 bushels; Barley 475,160 bushels; Flax 94,032 bushels, while increases are shown in Oats of 16,626 bushels and Rye 146,753 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- The grain stocks show a net increase of 34,201 bushels. Increases are shown in Barley and Rye of 16,282 and 39,343 bushels respectively while decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,488 bushels, Oats 17,934 bushels and Flax 2 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS, (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- The total grain in store shows a net increase of 4,845 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,226 bushels and Oats 3,619 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 30,893 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 17,763 and 13,765 bushels respectively, while Barley shows a decrease of 635 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- Grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 3,680,805 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,342,972 bushels; Oats 175,560 bushels; Barley 54,913 bushels; Flax 142,921 bushels, while a decrease is shown in Rye of 35,561 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.-- Stocks of Canadian Grain at these ports show a net decrease of 153,876 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 120,548 bushels, Oats 1,989 bushels and Rye 94,246 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 62,907 bushels.


