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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 1st, 1927

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 1st, 1927, show a net decrease of 2,118,373 bushels. Stocks were as follows:- Wheat 46,309,051; Oats 5,855,714; Barley 3,510,639; Flax 2,115,653 and Rye 1,145,074; a total of 59,536,131 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat and Oats of 2,280,530 and 216,486 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 256,747; Flax 24,860 and Rye 97,036 bushels.

Western Country Elevators:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 233,476 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 131,298; Barley 108,423; Flax 17,184 and Rye 1,259 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 24,688 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on June 24th, 1927, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1926.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - A net decrease is noted in the grain stocks of 14,817 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 21,187; Oats 6,987; Barley 7,606 and Flax 7,039, while Rye shows an increase of 2 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these ports show a net decrease of 538,699 bushels. Wheat stocks show a decrease of 542,235 bushels, while an increase of 3,536 bushels is noted in Oats.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at Prince Rupert Elevators are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 848,192 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat and Oats of 849,750 and 109,193 bushels respectively while increase are noted in Barley of 82,265; Flax 11,871 and Rye 16,615 bushels.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS:- Canadian grain stocks show a decrease of 171,944 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 151,583; Oats 4,871 and Barley 15,490 bushels.






