CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 8th, 1927

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 8th, 1927 show a net decrease of 651,383 bushels. Stocks were as follows:- Wheat 46,547,204, Oats 5,746,496, Barley 3,321,815 Flax 2,095,296 Rye 1,173,937 a total of 58,884,748 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 361,847, Oats 109,218, Barley 188,824 and Flax 20,357 bushels while an increase is noted in Rye of 28,863 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A net decrease is shown in the grain stocks of 954,420 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 876,269, Oats 70,049, Flax 24,483, and Rye 11,629 bushels while an increase is shown in Barley of 28,010 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 49,493 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 48,435 Barley 1,769 and Rye 1,499 bushels while oats shows an increase of 28,010 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these ports show a net decrease of 202,620 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 201,746 bushels and 874 bushels, respectively. While Barley shows an increase of 901 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- The stocks of wheat amount to 2,951 bushels same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 936,221 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 571,671, Oats 88,971 Barley 250,532 and Rye 37,104 bushels while flax shows a decrease of 12,057 bushels.




