CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 3, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 3, 1926, show a net decrease of 1,540,469 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 17,582,521 bushels; Oats 7,585,104 bushels; Barley 3,784,727 bushels; Flax 2,025,731 bushels; Rye 1,767,299 bushels, a total of 32,725,382 bushels.

Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,313,870 bushels; Oats 147,073 bushels; Flax 152,931 bushels; Rye 422,551 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 495,956 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The grain stocks show a net increase of 735,340 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 419,020 bushels; Oats 33,781 bushels; Barley 196,044 bushels; Rye 89,920 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 3,425 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS, (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 3,641 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats of 7,717 bushels. Flax 243 bushels and Rye 843 bushels, while Wheat and Barley show decreases of 5,097 and 65 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 68,842 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 44,231 bushels and Oats 24,824 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 213 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - Grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,570,029 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,391,421 bushels; Oats 247,460 bushels; Flax 89,404 and Rye 21,794 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 180,050 bushels.
