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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 10, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 10, 1926, show a net increase of 3,155,133 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 19,565,776 bushels; Oats 7,487,926 bushels; Barley 4,739,854 bushels; Flax 1,854,199 bushels; Rye 2,232,760 bushels, a total of 35,880,515 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,983,255 bushels; Barley 975,127 bushels; Rye 465,461 bushels, while decreases as noted in Oats and Flax of 97,178 and 171,532 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 2,355,295 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,842,142 bushels; Barley 312,983 bushels; Flax 5,086 bushels; Rye 199,236 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 4,152 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS, (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). A net decrease is shown in the grain stocks of 59,322 bushels. Decreases are shown in Oats of 45,898 bushels; Barley 5,348 bushels; Flax 5,984 bushels; Rye 3,039 bushels, while Wheat shows an increase of 947 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - A net increase is shown in the total grain of 72,799 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat and Oats of 57,378 and 17,036 bushels respectively, while Barley shows a decrease of 1,611 and Flax 4 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - Grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 2,009,227 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,385,310 bushels; Barley 625,841 bushels; Rye 261,229 bushels, while decreases are shown in Oats of 92,612 bushels and Flax 170,541 bushels.






