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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 17th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 17th, 1926, show a net increase of 1,399,211 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 21,021,410 bushels; Oats 7,078,344 bushels; Barley 4,643,612 bushels; Flax 1,631,421 bushels and Rye 2,904,939 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat and Rye of 1,455,634 and 672,179 bushels respectively, while Oats show a decrease of 409,532 bushels; Barley 96,242 bushels and Flax 222,778 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - An increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 1,316,341 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 1,250,586 bushels; Oats 23,279 bushels; Barley 22,690 bushels; Flax 12,283 bushels and Rye 7,503 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on September 10th, 1926, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1925.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 41,991 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 22,081 bushels; Oats 16,416 bushels; Barley 4,182 bushels and Flax 12 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 700 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain stocks of 40,287 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 72,608 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 32,204 and 117 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - Grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,515,978 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat and Rye of 1,499,659 and 332,188 bushels respectively while Oats show a decrease of 31,762 bushels; Barley 50,078 bushels and Flax 234,029 bushels.

Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,792,364 bushels; Rye 2,221,960 bushels; Corn 606,691 bushels; while decreases are noted in Oats and Barley of 1,588,303 and 525,359 bushels respectively.






