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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 24th, 1926.

Returns received as to the stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 24th, 1926, show a net increase of 3,677,202 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 23,036,396 bushels; Oats 6,884,257 bushels; Barley 6,060,113 bushels; Flax 1,737,075 bushels and Rye 3,138,587 bushels, making a total of 45,956,928 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 7,065,486 bushels; Barley 1,416,501 bushels; Flax 105,654 and Rye 283,648 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 194,087 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. An increase is shown in the total grain stocks of 3,416,142 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 2,848,611 bushels; Oats 95,673 bushels; Barley 377,460 bushels; Flax 28,620 and Rye 65,778 bushels.
