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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 7th, 1927.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 7th, 1927 show a net increase of 15,797,749 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 37,838,102, Oats 2,431,707, Barley 4,100,647, Flax 1,282,457 and Rye 3,252,206, a total of 48,905,119 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 13,985,811, Oats 31,520, Barley 1,185,389 and Rye 694,701, while Flax shows a decrease of 99,672 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 9,447,002 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 8,608,835, Oats 261,962, Barley 515,175, Flax 21,743 and Rye 39,287 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on September 30, 1927, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1926.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a net increase of 50,308 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 49,890 and Rye 2,698 bushels, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 1,105 and 675 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 257,059 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 209,166, Oats 22,798, Barley 5,716 and Rye 19,379 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. Stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR). Stocks at the Head of the lakes show a net increase of 5,584,465 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 5,037,381, Oats 37,475, Barley 122,463 and Rye 442,115 bushels while Flax shows a decrease of 114,969 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks for the week show an increase of 1,126,054 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 504,321, Oats 400,565, Barley 27,610, Flax 50,145 and Rye 143,422 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks show a net decrease of 477,061 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 624,418 and 95,848 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Barley of 18,815, Flax 4,351 and Rye 220,019 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS.- Canadian Grain stocks show an increase of 1,226,756 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 1,043,251; Barley 130,490 and Rye 53,015 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- Canadian grain stocks show a net decrease of 329,795 bushels. Wheat and Rye show decreases of 360,821 and 20,831 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 51,357 bushels.

DULUTH. The receipts by rail of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending October 8th, 1927 were as follows: Wheat 50,671 bushels; Barley 21,992 and Rye 3,015. There was one lake shipment of Wheat amounting to 28,099 bushels.

For the period from Aug. 1, 1927 to Oct. 8, 1927, the rail receipts amounted to Wheat 132,647; Oats 662; Barley 46,685 and Rye 21,618 bushels. Lake shipments were as follows:- Wheat 158,255; Oats 23,844; Barley 12,753; Flaxseed 12,510 and Rye 20,057; a total of 227,419 bushels. Shipments by rail were:- Wheat 2,534 and Flax 253 bushels.




