CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 14th, 1927.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for week ending October 14 show a net increase of 8,753,611 bush. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 45,199,822, Oats 2,788,809, Barley 4,883,699, Flax 1,244,698 and Rye 3,541,702, a total of 57,658,730 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 7,361,720, Oats 357,102, Barley 783,052 and Rye 289,496, while Flax shows a decrease of 37,759 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 466,480 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 79,169, Oats 218,690, Barley 113,834, Flax 13,906 and Rye 40,881 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on October 7, 1927, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1926.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show an increase of 25,151 bush. made up as follows: Wheat 21,425, Oats 2,434 and Barley 1,292 bush.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 217,045 bush. Increases are noted in Wheat 195,778 and Rye 31,039, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 4,216 and 5,556 bush. respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 95,220 bush.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 5,931,741 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 5,796,021, Oats 76,427 and Rye 409,576 bushels, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 218,455 and 131,828 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is noted in the grain stocks of 348,939 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 314,648, Oats 24,662; Barley 7,064 and Rye 3,905, while Flax shows a decrease of 1,340 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 304,627 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 94,154, Barley 218,803 and Flax 81,438, while Oats and Rye show decreases of 13,145 and 76,623 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks show a net decrease of 79,241 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 10,427 and Rye 154,541, while Oats and Barley show increases of 4,250 and 81,477 bushels respectively.

U.S. LAKE PORTS.- Canadian Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,383,633 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 849,786; Oats 48,000; Barley 532,892 and Flax 65 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 47,110 bushels.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- Canadian grain stocks show a net increase of 60,016 bushels. Increases are noted in Barley and Rye of 51,701 and Rye 82,369 bushels, while Wheat shows a decrease of 74,054 bushels.

DULUTH. The receipts by rail of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending October 15th, 1927 were as follows: Wheat 158,971 bushels; Barley 64,390 and Rye 2,890 and Flaxseed 65 bushels. There were no lake shipments during the week.

For the period from Aug. 1, 1927 to Oct. 15, 1927, the rail receipts amounted to Wheat 291,618; Oats 662; Barley 111,075 and Rye 24,508 and Flaxseed 65 bushels. Lake shipments were as follows: Wheat 158,255; Oats 23,844; Barley 12,753; Flaxseed 12,510 and Rye 20,057; a total of 227,419 bushels. Shipments by rail were:- Wheat 2,534 and Flax 253 bushels, the same as the previous week.


