CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 21st, 1927

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for week ending October 21 show a net increase of 3,654,132 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 48,072,575, Oats 3,297,336; Barley 5,127,853; Flax 1,183,714 and Rye 3,631,384 a total of 61,312,862 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 2,872,753, Oats 508,527, Barley 244,154 and Rye 89,682, while Flax shows a decrease of 60,984 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net increase of 105,584 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats 312,832, Barley 36,097, and Flax 2,075 bushels while Wheat and Rye show decreases of 221,513 and 23,907 bushels respectively.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on October 14th, 1927, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1926.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net increase of 49,241 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 27,234, Oats 22,902 and Rye 1,076, while Barley shows a decrease of 1,971 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 373,369 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 346,847, Barley 4,358 and Rye 46,269 while Oats show a decrease of 19,105 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS:- Wheat stocks at this elevator show a decrease of 93,291 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 3,086,030 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat 3,060,019, Barley 129,655 and Flax 99,965, bushels while Oats, and Rye show decreases of 93,558 and 110,051 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS. - A net increase is noted in the grain stocks of 807,892 bush. Wheat and Oats show increases of 724,941 and 100,858 bush, respectively while decreases are noted in Barley 12,709, Flax 1,494 and Rye 3,704 bush.


PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 443,661. Increases are noted in Wheat 409,378, Oats 1,182, Flax 68,448 and Rye 6,372, while Barley shows a decrease of 41,719 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 877,118 bushels, Wheat and Barley show increases of 351,907 and 679,407 bushels, respectively, while decreases are noted in Oats 88,655, Flax 30,048 and Rye 154,196 bush.



DULUTH. - The receipts by rail of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending October 22nd, 1927 were as follows: Wheat 34,324 bushels; Barley 9,206 and Rye 2,465. There were no lake shipments during the week.

For the period from Aug. 1, 1927 to Oct. 22, 1927, the rail receipts amounted to Wheat 325,942; Oats 662; Barley 120,281 Rye 26,973 and Flaxseed 65 bushels. Lake shipments were as follows: Wheat 158,255; Oats 23,844; Barley 12,753; Flaxseed 12,510 and Rye 20,057; a total of 227,419 bushels. Shipments by rail were:- Wheat 2,534 and Flax 253 bushels, the same as the previous week.
