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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 28th, 1927.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for week ending October 28, 1927 show a net increase of 15,289,540 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 60,638,977, Oats 4,343,234, Barley 6,730,633, Flax 1,412,512 and Rye 3,447,046 total of 76,602,402 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 12,566,402, Oats 15,898, Barley 1,602,780 and Flax 228,798, while Rye shows a decrease of 154,338 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 10,250,107 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 8,776,420, Oats 729,625, Barley 470,806, Flax 259,054 and Rye 14,202 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show an increase of 169,605 bush. made up as follows:- Wheat 131,373, Oats 29,188, Barley 5,454 and Rye 3,590 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,740,254 bush. Increases are noted in Wheat 1,821,083 and Barley 1,172, while Oats and Rye show decreases of 7,457 and 74,544 bushels respectively.


PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN).- Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 921,851. Wheat and Rye show increases of 739,473 and 244,641 bushels, while decreases are noted in Oats 60,070, Barley 345 and Rye 1,848 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 105,823 bush. Decreases are noted in Wheat 3,596, Oats 81,845, Barley 32,679 and Rye 13,054, while Flax shows an increase of 25,351 bush.
