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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 16th, 1927

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for week ending December 16, 1927 show an increase of 11,654,989 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 149,523,846; Oats 10,871,294; Barley 9,644,916; Flax 2,945,001 and Rye 3,971,564; a total of 176,956,621 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 10,719,967; Oats 332,364; Barley 546,439; Flax 41,683 and Rye 14,536 bushels.

Western Country Elevators. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net increase of 1,663,602 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 1,430,404; Oats 232,926; Barley 28,141 and Rye 4,497, while Flax show a decrease of 32,366 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on December 9th, 1927, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1926.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 28,447 bush. Wheat shows a decrease of 58,111, while Oats and Barley show increases of 24,800 and 4,864 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 664,142 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat 666,947 and Oats 9,334 bush., while Barley and Rye show increases of 153 and 11,986 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at this elevator show an increase of 22,573 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 22,515 and Oats 58 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show an increase of 6,558,784 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 5,712,998; Oats 198,664; Barley 410,212; Flax 102,195 and Rye 1,74,715 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS. - A net increase is noted in the grain stocks of 290,608 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 318,201; Oats 27,932 and Rye 385 bushels, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 54,364 and 1,546 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks for the week show an increase of 2,767,280 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 2,837,327; Barley 32639, while decreases are noted in Oats 34,798; Flax 26,963 and Rye 40,925 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks show an increase of 676,196 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 753,212 and Rye 22,474 bushels, while Oats and Barley show a decrease of 98,271 and 1,219 bushels, respectively.

DULUTH. - The receipts by rail of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending December 17, 1927 were as follows: Wheat 11,047; Barley 1,768 bushels; Flax-seed 364 bushels. There was a shipment of Oats by rail amounting to 433 bushels.
