CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 6th, 1928

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Jan. 6, 1928, show a net increase of 878,893 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 159,845,000, Oats 11,219,453, Barley 10,022,474, Flax 3,018,783, Rye 4,483,683, a total of 188,589,393 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 487,443, Oats 175,329, and Rye 378,911 bushels, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 7,734 and 155,056 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net decrease of 297,336 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 351,292; Barley 52,661; Flax 25,388 and Rye 42,860, while Oats shows an increase of 174,865.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on December 30th, 1927, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1926.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 48,877 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 73,361 and Barley 463, while increases are shown in Oats 21,628; Flax 1,644 and Rye 1,673 bush.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 693,856 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 708,231 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 12,015 and 2,360 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at this elevator show a net decrease of 120,378 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 120,448, while Oats show an increase of 70 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 5,813,218 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 5,314,609; Barley 282,963; Flax 65,286, and Rye 170,767, while Oats show a decrease of 20,407 bushels.




