CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 3, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Feb. 3, 1928 show a net decrease of 605,988 bush. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 165,688,528 Oats 11,755,443, Barley 10,588,153, Flax 3,078,290 and Rye 4,992,863 bush., a total of 196,103,277 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 1,523,683 bushels, while increases are noted in Oats 249,026, Barley 198,206, Flax 2,010 and Rye 156,746 bushels.

Western Country Elevators. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net decrease of 372,290 bush. Decreases are noted in Wheat 626,645, Barley 19,078 and Flax 20,538 bush., while Oats and Rye show increases of 290,524 and 3,447 bushels respectively.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on January 27th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show an increase of 884,303 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 789,502; Oats 57,056; Barley 28,060; Flax 1,633 and Rye 8,052 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,149 bush.. Wheat shows an increase of 13,236 bush., while decreases are noted in Oats 9,961, Barley 711 and Rye 1,415 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at this elevator show an increase of 114,883 bush. made up as follows: Wheat 114,793; and Oats 90 bushels.
