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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 2, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 2 1928, shows a net decrease of 2,525,565 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 163,580,840; Oats 13,056,690; Barley 10,290,129; Flax 3,108,782 and Rye 5,115,617 bushels; a total of 195,152,058 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat and Flax of 3,063,776 and 18,194 bushels respectively, while Oats show an increase of 246,921; Barley 106,436 and Rye 203,048 bushels.

Western Country Elevators. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,169,630 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat 1,247,687, Barley 49,089, Flax 26,609 and Rye 38,628 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 192,383 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on February 24, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.
