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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 9th, 1928

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 9, 1928 show a net decrease of 1,924,458 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 161,787,798; Oats 13,301,130; Barley 10,114,287; Flax 3,080,932 and Rye 4,943,453, a total of 193,227,600 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat 1,793,042; Barley 175,842; Flax 27,850 and Rye 172,164 bushels while Oats shows an increase of 244,440 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net decrease of 364,272 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat 507,865; Barley 42,475 and Flax 34,677 bushels, while Oats & Rye show increases of 209,953 and 10,792 bushels respectively.






