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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 23rd, 1928

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 23, 1928 show a net decrease of 3,980,026 bushels over the previous week. Stocks were as follows:- Wheat 154,238,577; Oats 13,195,586; Barley 9,760,500; Flax 3,011,356 and Rye 4,940,593, a total of 185,146,612 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,944,066; Flax 44,901 and Rye 219,887 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 168,803 and 60,020 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 102,832 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats and Rye of 229,594 and 38,043 bushels respectively, while Wheat shows a decrease of 138,787; Barley 11,209 and Flax 14,309 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on March 16, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for week show a net increase of 18,723 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 32,632; Flax 2,845 and Rye 2,800 bushels, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 18,683 and 951 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 423,742 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 424,864; Barley 295 and Rye 1,673 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 3,090 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 27,435 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 26,986 bushels; Oats 449 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 362,471 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 236,390; Oats 75,483; Barley 56,346 and Rye 22,507 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 28,255 bushels.



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


