CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 30th, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 30th, 1928 show a net decrease of 4,381,966 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 149,656,406, Oats 13,334,204, Barley 9,601,565, Flax 2,976,048, Rye 4,986,423, a total of 150,764,646 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,582,171 and Flax 35,308 bushels, while increases are shown in Oats of 138,618, Barley 41,065 and Rye 55,830 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 844,451 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat 1,096,519, Barley 21,004, Flax 4,387 and Rye 14,396 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 291,855 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on March 23, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 138,381 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 105,398, Oats 43,949 and Barley 7,107 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 13,559 and 7,584 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 411,825 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 407,383 and Rye 6,170 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 312 and 1,421 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 74,811 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 74,085 and Oats 726 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM & PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 427,636 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat 300,053, Oats 71,733, Barley 55,220 and Rye 25,124, while Flax shows a decrease of 24,494 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS.— A net decrease is noted in the grain stocks of 184,118 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 157,793; Oats 45,980 and Flax 7,736 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 17,161 and 10,230 bushels.


PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN).— Grain stocks for the week show a decrease of 1,522,792 bushels, made up as follows:— Wheat 1,495,242; Oats 18,300 and Flax 9,250 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN).— Grain stocks show a yet decrease of 193,721 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 143,354 and Oats 77,083, while Barley and Rye show increases of 520 and 26,196 bushels, respectively.

The total grain stocks at the St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports were as follows:— Wheat 6,840,262; Oats 728,170; Barley 430,639 and Rye 271,982, a total of 8,271,053 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS.- Canadian grain stocks show a net decrease of 677,366 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 797,080 bushels and Barley an increase of 119,714 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- A net decrease is shown in the Canadian grain stocks of 762,137 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 605,365, Oats 39,244, Barley 124,860 bushels.

DULUTH. - Receipts by rail of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending March 31st, 1928, amounted to Wheat 2,474 bushels and Barley 1,834 bushels. Shipments by rail were: Nil.

For the period from Aug. 1, 1927 to Mar. 31st, 1928, the rail receipts amounted to Wheat 550,049; Oats 662; Barley 303,839; Rye 38,674 and Flax 18,394 bushels. Lake shipments were as follows: Wheat 435,663; Oats 23,844; Barley 191,291; Flax 12,510 and Rye 43,740, a total of 707,048 bushels. 


