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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 6, 1928

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 6, 1928 show a decrease of 4,661,997 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 145,720,988; Oats 12,893,993; Barley 9,572,709; Flax 2,929,598; Rye 4,935,361, a total of 176,102,649 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,935,418; Oats 440,211; Barley 225,356; Flax 46,450 and Rye 11,062 bushels.

Western Country Elevators. Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 2,675,156 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,259,180, Oats 223,971, Barley 149,637, Flax 29,130 and Rye 13,538 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY) - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 246,392 bushels. Wheat and Barley show decreases of 251,745 and 28,051 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Oats 10,559, Flax 8,502 and Rye 12,343 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 45,711 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 49,095 bushels, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 771 and 2,613 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 13,721 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 19,023 bushels while Oats show an increase of 302 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 35,261 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 42,742, Barley 47,916 and Rye 24,922 bushels while Oats and Flax show decreases of 22,548 and 6,773 bushels respectively.




