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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 22nd, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 22nd, 1928 show a net decrease of 3,434,958 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 100,829,024, Oats 8,615,344, Barley 3,591,870, Flax 1,754,309 and Rye 2,605,828, a total of 117,396,375 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,791,449, Oats 496,703, Barley 273,012 and Flax 129,601 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 255,807 bushels.

Western Country Elevators:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 2,750,077 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 2,694,013, Oats 34,986, Barley 9,513, Flax 19,366 and Rye 17,199 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on June 15th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 133,181 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 59,940, Oats 63,814, Barley 6,648 and Rye 2,779 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 145,241 bushels. Wheat and Oats show an increase of 138,640 and 6,807 bushels respectively, while Barley shows a decrease of 206 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS:- Wheat stocks are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 2,025,817 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,590,686, Oats 357,664, Barley 42,732 and Flax 81,055 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 46,320 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS. - A net increase is noted in the grain stocks of 32,773 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 107,041 and Rye 1,939, while decreases are noted in Oats of 69,536, Barley 4,344 and Flax 2,327 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 203,811 bushels, Wheat and Rye show increases of 583,577 and 50,057 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in Oats of 308,162, Barley 94,807 and Rye 26,853 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 470,572 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats of 475,822 and Rye 212,108 bushels, while Wheat and Barley show decreases of 153,980 and 63,378 bushels respectively.

U.S. LAKE PORTS.- Canadian grain stocks show a net increase of 643,930 bushels. An increase is noted on wheat of 905,363 bushels, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 146,216 and 115,217 bushels respectively.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.- Stocks of Canadian grain show a net increase of 2,789 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats of 1,046 and Barley 63,833 bushels, while Wheat and Rye show decreases of 27,451 and 34,639 bushels respectively.

DULUTH.- The receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending June 23, 1928, amounted to Wheat 3,928 bushels. There were no shipments during the week.

For the period from Aug. 1, 1927 to June 23, 1928, the rail receipts amounted to Wheat 731,627; Oats 662, Barley 340,176; Rye 38,674 and Flax 18,394 bushels. Lake shipments were as follows:- Wheat 764,365; Oats 23,844; Barley 249,414; Flax 12,510 and Rye 43,740 bushels, a total of 1,093,873 bushels. 
