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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 2nd, 1927.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 2nd show a net decrease of 5,132,377 bushels. Stocks were as follows:- Wheat 25,185,-042; Oats 2,850,250; Barley 981,069; Flax 1,534,754; Rye 872,123; a total of 31,423,023 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 4,239,934; Oats 642,306; Barley 196,093 and Flax 141,691 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 87,647 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 273,905 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat, 28,049, Oats 30,240, Barley 52,628 and Rye 163,905 bushels while Flax shows a decrease of 917 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on August 26th, 1927, with comparison for, the previous week and the same period 1926.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- A decrease is noted in the grain stocks of 67,413 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat, 61,572 Oats 4,497 and Flax 4,481 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 1,170 and 1,967 bushels, respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 6,998 bushels, wheat and oats show increases of 2,455 and 4,683 bushels respectively while Barley shows a decrease of 140 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- Stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 2,978,502 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat 2,334,222, Oats 451,106, Flax 113,982 and Rye 98,757 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 19,565 bushels.
