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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 13th, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 13th, 1928, show a net decrease of 5,636,242 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 87,081,011, Oats 7,350,482, Barley 3,299,995, Flax 1,473,362 and Rye 2,203,014, a total of 101,407,864 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,925, 885, Oats 328,508, Flax 253,371 and Rye 157,645 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 29,167 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 3,100,199 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 2,451,104, Oats 362,329, Barley 169,525, Flax 59,122 and Rye 58,119 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on July 6th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,574,213 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,916,313, Flax 40,065 and Rye 38,568 bushels while Oats and Barley show decreases of 421,162 and 71 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). Grain stocks show a net decrease of 763,063 bushels. Wheat and Rye show decreases of 868,673 and 133,098 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Oats of 202,017, Barley 15,979 and Flax 20,712 bushels.

U.S. LAKE PORTS. - Canadian grain stocks show a net increase of 1,734,502 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,711,703; Oats 34,674; Flax 1,068 and Rye 88 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 13,031 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. - Stocks of Canadian grain show a net decrease of 40,624 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 30,901; Oats 19,962 and Rye 50,863 bushels, while Barley and Flax show increases of 5,965 and 4,274 bushels respectively.

DULUTH. - The receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending July 14, 1928, amounted to Rye 88 and Flax 1,068 bushels. There were no shipments during the week.

For the period from Aug. 1, 1927 to July 16, 1928, the rail receipts amounted to Wheat 737,168; Oats 662; Barley 347,767; Rye 38,762 and Flax 19,462 bushels. Lake shipments were as follows:- Wheat 786,056; Oats 23,844; Barley 249,414; Flax 12,510 and Rye 43,740, a total of 1,115,564 bushels. 




