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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 27th, 1928

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 27th, 1928, show a decrease of 9,037,235 bushels. Stocks were as follows: Wheat 70,878,439; Oats 6,391,943; Barley 2,205,776; Flax 1,377,297 and Rye 1,712,106, a total of 82,565,561 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 7,247,287; Oats 695,033; Barley 769,663; Flax 15,005 and Rye 310,247 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 2,763,762 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 1,830,638; Oats 583,241; Barley 193,667; Flax 87,181 and Rye 69,035 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on July 20th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 146,837 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 124,783; Oats 14,804 and Flax 7,250 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 412,292 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 412,061 and 999 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 768 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS: Stocks of grain at this elevator remain the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 4,523,924 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,386,422; Barley 262,200 and Rye 126,811 bushels, while Oats and Flax show increases of 153,715 and 97,794 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS:- A net increase is noted in the grain stocks of 56,022 bushels. Wheat and Flax show increases of 86,349 and 6,697 bushels, while decreases are noted in Oats of 18,276, Barley 17,652 and Rye 1,094 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). Grain stocks for the week show a net decrease of 89,050 bushels. Decreases are noted in Oats of 105,158, Barley 1,178, Flax 25,065 and Rye 36,476, while Wheat shows an increase of 78,827 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). Grain stocks show a decrease of 190,917 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 66,144, Oats 46,532; Barley 5,888 and Rye 72,353 bushels.




