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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 3rd, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 3rd, 1928, show a net decrease of 6,259,651 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 66,054,685, Oats 5,548,618, Barley 2,265,426, Flax 1,193,648 and Rye 1,243,533, a total of 76,305,910 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,823,754, Oats 843,325, Flax 183,649 and Rye 468,573 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 59,650 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 1,847,442 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,218,955, Oats 404,068, Barley 158,682, Flax 40,295 and Rye 25,442 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 617,667 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 617,731, Flax 3,624, and Rye 75 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 3,106 and 658 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 38,990 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 90,329, Barley 743 and Rye 1,220 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 3,302 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Wheat stocks at this elevator show a decrease of 319,742 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 5,845,600 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,175,265, Barley 91,203, Flax 52,149 and Rye 556,000 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 29,017 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,758,285 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,730,619 Barley 20,222 and Rye 201,922 while Oats and Flax show decreases of 115,483 and 78,995 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). Grain stocks show a net increase of 606,637 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 928,385 and Barley 41,175 bushels, while Oats and Rye show decreases of 274,209 and 83,714 bushels respectively.
