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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 12, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 12, 1928, show a net increase of 33,816,925 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 133,696,646; Oats 6,112,016; Barley 14,274,656; Flax 767,218 and Rye 3,102,191, a total of 157,952,727 bushels. Increases were noted in Wheat of 30,486,529; Oats 1,789,783; Barley 2,151,596 and Flax 321,489 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 932,472 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 18,649,738 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 16,310,431; Oats 1,263,785; Barley 736,095; Flax 220,854 and Rye 118,573 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on October 5th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 295,177 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 284,722 bushels; Oats 5,465 bushels; Barley 5,722 bushels and Flax 104, while Rye shows a decrease of 836 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,529,654 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,533,342 bushels, and Barley 2,207 bushels, while Oats and Rye show decreases of 4,317 and 1,578 bushels, respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS:- Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 5,118 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 7,578,566 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 7,664,056 bushels; Oats 234,816 bushels; Barley 675,590 bushels, and Flax 40,381 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 1,036,277 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN).- Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,431,701 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,038,989; Oats 213,990 and Barley 192,002 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 13,280 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST SEABOARD (CANADIAN GRAIN):- Grain stocks show a net increase of 414,602 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 403,278; Barley 87,422 and Flax 66,997 bushels, while Oats and Rye show decreases of 134,534 and 8,561 bushels, respectively.


