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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 26th, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 26th, 1928 show an increase of 4,455,482 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 149,779,180, Oats 8,370,947, Barley 16,434,209, Flax 1,097,061 and Rye 3,454,716, a total of 179,192,551 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 2,574,043, Oats 1,010,207, Barley 561,356, Flax 55,106 and Rye 254,770 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 5,212,253 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,399,902, Barley 168,975, and Rye 4,360 bushels, while Oats and Flax show increases of 318,100 and 42,887 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on October 19th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks for the week show a net decrease of 178,262 bushels. Barley and Flax shows decreases of 240,842 and 27,143 bushel respectively while increases are noted in Wheat of 13,594, Oats 21,874 and Rye 54,255 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST SEABOARD (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 910,136 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 726,421, Oats 17,094, Barley 170,130 and Rye 63,468 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 55,997 bushels.




