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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 2nd, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 2, 1928 show a net increase of 823,336 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat, 69,669,462; Oats, 5,297,070; Barley 5,219,119; Flax, 759,515 and Rye, 1,326,479, a total of 82,271,645 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat, 325,665; Oats, 493,851; Flax, 121,613 and Rye, 4,783, while Barley shows a decrease of 122,581 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 823,336 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 325,665; Oats, 493,851; Flax, 121,-618 and Rye, 4,783, while Barley shows a decrease of 122,581 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):-Stocks for the week show an increase of 2,052,390 bushels, made up as follows:-Wheat, 2,029,358; Oats, 11,576; Barley, 4,444 and Rye 7,012 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:-Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 346,645 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat, 352,185 bushels; Oats, 1,021 and Rye, 1,001 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 7,562 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:-Wheat stocks at this elevator shows an increase of 3,037 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR):-Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 336,537 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats, 468,252; Barley, 264,531 and Rye 56,433, while Wheat and Flax show decreases of 451,-194 and 1,485 bushels respectively.
