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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 23rd, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 23, show a net increase of 6,621,693 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat, 132,240,054; Oats, 14,274,114; Barley, 20,251,233; Flax, 1,527,439 and Rye, 4,143,399, a total of 222,441,239 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 7,007,603 and 1,924,304 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in Barley of 185,603; Flax, 92,903 and Rye, 32,303 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net increase of 1,597,856 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 944,211; Oats, 466,134; Barley, 306,017 and Rye, 16,437, while Flax shows a decrease of 134,943 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on November 16th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 992,211 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 980,775; Oats, 12,407 Barley, 308 and Flax 306 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 1,485 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.-Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 161,937 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat, 129,486; Oats, 9,976 and Barley, 22,475 bush.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.-Stocks at this elevator show an increase of 494,749 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat, 494,055 and Oats, 694 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).-Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,104,204 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 820,578 Barley, 159,057; Flax, 202,547 and Rye, 185,389 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 263,364 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN).- Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,474,167 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 935,828; Oats, 442,395; Flax, 208,732 and Rye, 124,335 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 234,123 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST SEABOARD (CANADIAN GRAIN).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,317,670 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 901,042; Oats, 433,094; Flax, 39,778 and Rye, 12,318 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 123,562 bushels.




