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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 4, 1929

Returns received as to stocks of grains in store for the week ending Jan. 4, 1929 show a net increase of 1,489,102 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 229,935,331, Oats 21,455,886, Barley 23,137,321, Flax 1,854,656 and Rye 4,941,075, a total of 281,324,269 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,560,319, Oats 22,597 and Rye 89,428 while Barley and Flax show decreases of 121,113 and 62,129 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net decrease of 610,316 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,051,228, Flax 76,156 and Rye 10,113 bushels while Oats and Barley show increases of 485,520 and 41,661 bushels respectively.
