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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 1, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 1, 1929 show a net decrease of 4,180,884 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 213,396,933, Oats 21,805,342, Barley 20,975,993, Flax 1,719,490, Rye 4,833,831, a total of 262,731,589 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,119,561, Barley 347,410 and Flax 18,375, while Oats and Rye show increases of 257,225 and 47,237 bushels, respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,451,664 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,847,371 and Flax 10,066 bushels, while increases are noted in Oats of 275,480, Barley 115,992 and Rye 14,301 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on January 25th, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 389,518 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 380,875, Oats 5,647 and Barley 2,996 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 650,816 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 669,478 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 9,088 and 9,574 bushels, respectively.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR - Stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 41,390 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,232,035 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,178,299, Barley 48,456, Flax 3,182 and Rye 50,926 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 48,828 bushels.


Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,194,782 and Barley 119,144 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 226,530 bushels.

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
