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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 15, 1929

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 15, 1929 show a net decrease of 6,698,435 bushels. Stocks were as follows:- Wheat 204,412,590; Oats 21,777,670; Barley 21,010,252; Flax 1,684,503 and Rye 4,707,493, a total of 253,592,508 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 6,084,513; Oats 73,537; Barley 537,874; Flax 30,065, while Rye shows an increase of 27,554 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net increase of 295,778 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats of 653,840; Barley 166,148 and Rye 22,895 bushels, while Wheat and Flax show decreases of 536,970 and 10,135 bushels respectively.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on February 15, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 546,103 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 568,717 bushels while increases are noted in Oats of 12,126; Barley 1,732 and Flax 8,756 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,620,943 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,620,714; Oats 5,444 and Rye 11,989, while Barley shows an increase of 17,204 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator show a decrease of 72,578 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 3,982 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 563,280 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 542,442; Barley 103,077 and Rye 13,929 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 80,156 and 12,012 bushels respectively.
