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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 22, 1929

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 22, 1929 show a net decrease of 3,265,203 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 193,550,745, Oats 24,198,075, Barley 20,492,684, Flax 1,398,345 and Rye 4,870,536, a total of 244,510,385 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,909,711, Oats 55,127, Barley 230,949 and Flax 210,579, while Rye shows an increase of 14,163 bush.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,043,745, Wheat and Flax show decreases of 1,250,501 and 2,916 bushels respectively while increases are note in Oats of 112,767, Barley 53,759 and Rye 43,146 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 385,219 bushels. Wheat and Flax show decreases of 394,355 and 10,217 bushels respectively, while Oats and Rye show increases of 15,693 and 660 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 35,194 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 7,275 bushels while Oats and Barley show decreases of 10,212 and 27,345 bushels respectively.


