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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 29, 1929

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 29, 1929, show a net decrease of 4,250,842 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 189,656,720; Oats 24,517,554; Barley 20,250,321; Flax 1,300,204; Rye 4,534,744, a total of 240,259,543 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,894,025; Barley 242,363; Flax 98,141, and Rye 335,792, while Oats show an increase of 319,479 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 909,088 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,023,103; Flax 4,773 and Rye 14,482, while Oats and Barley show increases of 114,790 and 18,480 bushels respectively.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on March 22nd, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 231,587 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 227,243; Oats 2,980; Flax 2,983 and Rye 1 bushel, while Barley shows an increase of 1,620 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 297,712 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 302,339 and Oats 7,199, while Barley shows an increase of 11,826 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 2,272 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR - Stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show an increase of 2,253,689 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,631,743; Oats 350,634; Barley 202,343; Flax 3,910 and Rye 65,059 bushels.
