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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 24, 1928

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 24, 1928, show a net decrease of 7,868,340 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 38,018,909; Oats 4,010,167; Barley 1,323,165; Flax 929,372 and Rye 598,076, a total of 44,879,689 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 7,510,281; Oats 262,937 and in 307,907 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 139,163 and 73,622 bushels, respectively.

Western Country Elevators:- Stocks of grain in these elevators show a net decrease of 211,983 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 80,595, Oats 76,481, Barley 37,735, Flax 24,505 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 7,333 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on August 17th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSEJAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 244,762 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 229,509, Oats 8,340 and Flax 6,913 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 319,406 bushels, Wheat shows a decrease of 325,871 bushels while Oats and Barley show increase of 5,738, and 727 bushels respectively.


PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - LAKE PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN):- Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,450,060 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,423,192 and Rye 44,958 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 469 and 17,621 bushels, respectively.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST-SEABOARD PORTS(CANADIAN GRAIN):-Grain stocks show a net decrease of 505,352 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 749,094; Barley 4,098 and Flax 78,969 bushels, while Oats and Rye show increases of 289,511 and 37,298 bushels.
