CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 3, 1929

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 3rd, show a decrease of 6,772,316 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 164,981,735, Oats 21,663,676, Barley 16,866,797, Flax 1,103,185, and Rye 4,209,- 599, a total of 208,824,992 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,561,415, Oats 941,867, Barley 1,078,751, Flax 60,679 and Rye 129,604 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 6,776,378 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 3,858,737, Oats 1,400,945, Barley 1,296-013, Flax 33,729 and Rye 186,954 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on April 26th, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY): Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 345,807 bushels. Wheat and Barley show decrease of 354,582 and 955 bushels respectively, while Oats and Flax show increases of 3,352 and 6,378 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS: Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 171,631 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 170,347 and 6,609 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 5,325 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR: Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 3,029 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR: Oat stocks at this elevator show a decrease of 1,654 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR): Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,736,930 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 168,898, Oats 290,246 and Flax 29,513 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increase of 103,124 and 161,603 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MANUFACTURING ELEVATORS:- A net decrease of 22,629 bushels is noted in the grain stocks for the week. Decreases are noted in Oats of 35,579, Barley 24,972 and Flax 3,815, while Wheat and Rye show increases of 42,081 and 656 bushels respectively.




