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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 24, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 24, 1929, show a net decrease of 8,337,890 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat, 148,283,916; Oats, 20,137,423; Barley, 15,859,570; Flax, 975,680, and Rye, 3,704,779, a total of 188,961,368 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 7,647,893; Oats 58,557; Barley 192,231, and Rye 456,474, while Flax shows an increase of 17,065 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 4,292,566 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat, 2,548,830; Oats, 1,163,502; Barley 489,673; Flax, 26,071, and Rye, 64,490 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSEJAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY): Stocks for the week show a decrease of 107,618 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat, 83,305; Oats, 16,118; Barley 1 and Flax, 8,194 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 15,121 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 12,263 and 7,904 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 5,046 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR:- Stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR: Wheat stocks at this elevator show a decrease of 16 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR): Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 5,911,659 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,688,373, Oats 60,206, Barley 36,996 and Rye 160,541, while Flax shows an increase of 34,457 bushels.

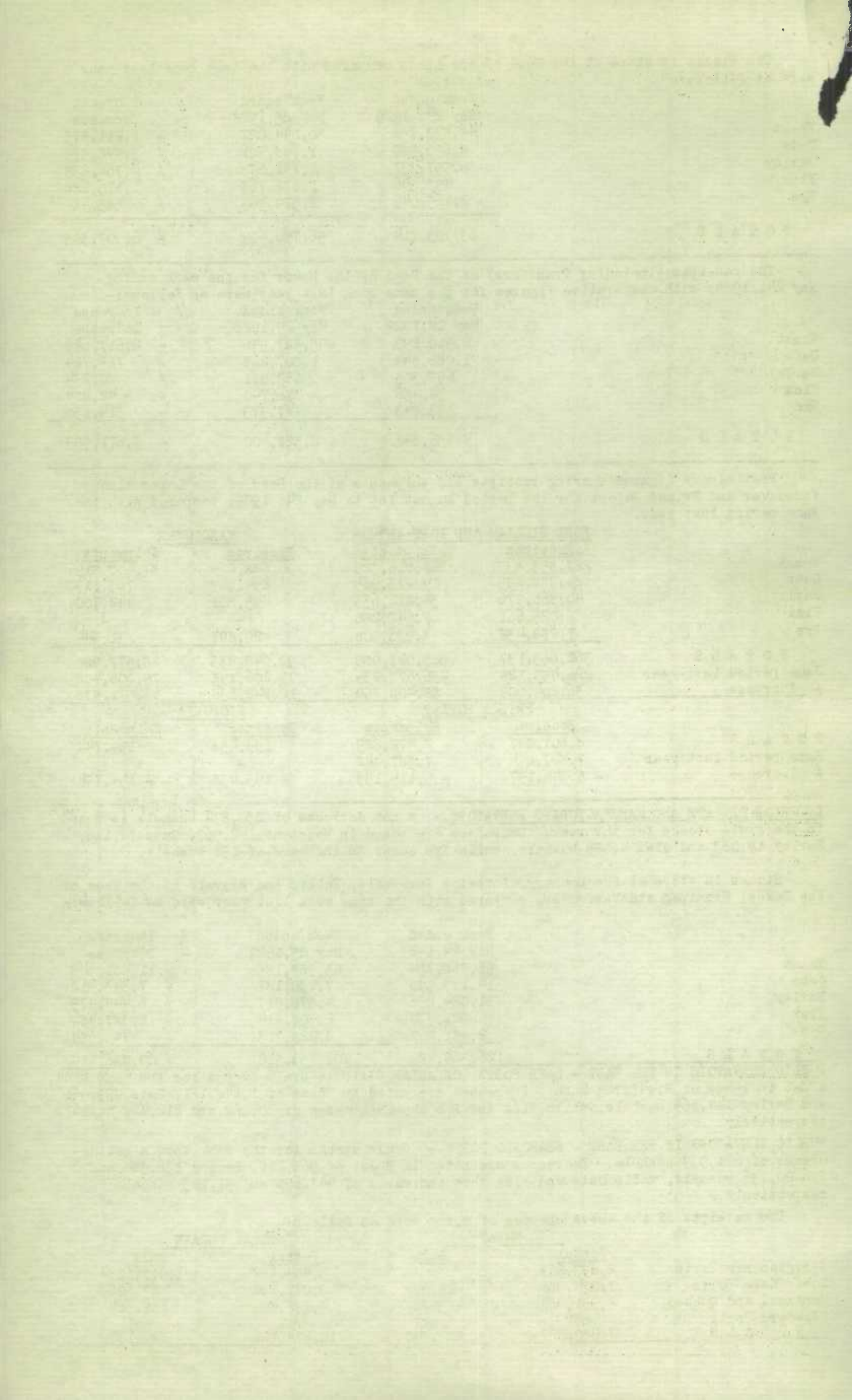
