CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 31, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 31, 1929, show a net decrease of 7,685,852 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 142,546,485, Oats 19,220,462, Barley 14,570,862, Flax 939,227, Rye 3,998,480, a total of 181,275,516 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,737,431, Oats 916,961, Barley 1,288,708 and Flax 36,453, while Rye shows an increase of 293,701 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 1,774,382 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 1,063,712; Oats 388,455; Barley 255,715; Flax 8,335 and Rye 53,165 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSEJAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY): Stocks for the week show a decrease of 71,020 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 57,015; Oats 8,432 and Flax 5,573 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,015,758 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,010,162 and Oats 7,533 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 1,713 and 224 bushels respectively.






