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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 21, 1929

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 21, 1929, show a net decrease of 5,569,100 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 123,139,671; Oats 17,342,383; Barley 11,157,452; Flax 633,943 and Rye 3,598,072, a total of 155,871,521 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,550,079; Oats 182,026 and Barley 1,300,033, while Flax and Rye show increases of 36,681 and 427,257 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 4,048,105 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 3,288,455; Oats 451,052; Barley 244,448; Flax 21,694 and Rye 42,456 bushels.
