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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 31, 1928

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 31, 1928, show a decrease of 8,440,321 bushels. Stocks were as follows: wheat 30,887,410; Oats 3,334,053; Barley 1,213,453; Flax 531,102; Rye 473,350, a total of 36,439,368 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 7,131,499; Oats 676,114; Barley 109,712; Flax 398,270 and Rye 124,726 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net increase of 105,490 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 44,381, Barley 57,976, Flax 3,558 and Rye 75,054, while Oats show a decrease of 75,459 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on August 24th, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSEJAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 54,678 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 48,384, Barley 67, Flax 6,573 and Rye 1,094 bushels while Oats shows an increase of 1,440 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 695,742 bushels, Wheat and Barley show decreases of 708,103 and 805 bushels respectively while Oats show an increase of 13,166 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Wheat stocks at this elevators are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 2,977,395 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,380,114, Oats 212,458, Flax 393,846 and Rye 8,634 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 17,157 bushels.




U.S. LAKE PORTS:- Canadian grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,697,133 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,703,000 and Barley 59,149 bushels, while Oats and Rye show increases of 63,403 and 1,608 bushels, respectively.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS:- Stocks of Canadian grain show a net decrease of 183,888 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 32,873; Barley 116,910 and Rye 51,743 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 17,638 bushels.

DULUTH:- The receipts of Canadian grain at Duluth for the week ending September 1st, 1928, were Wheat 8,403; Barley 1,851 and Rye 1,608 bushels. There were no shipments during the week.
