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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 19, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 19, 1929, show a net decrease of 1,952,682 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 110,944,714, Oats 16,649,630, Barley 8,571,254, Flax 480,427, Rye 3,495,711, a total of 140,141,736 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,387,478, Oats 98,751, Barley 531,333, and Flax 8,696 while Rye shows an increase of 73,576 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 3,173,559 bush., made up as follows:- Wheat, 1,875,347, Oats 732,224, Barley 421,000, Flax 51,706, and Rye 93,282 bushels.


