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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 26, 1929

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 26, 1929, show a net decrease of 1,902,304 bush. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 109,033,039, Oats 15,979,820, Barley 9,230,209, Flax 436,631 and Rye 3,559,733, a total of 138,239,432 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,911,675, Oats 669,810 and Flax 43,796 bushels while Barley and Rye show increases of 658,955 and 64,022 bushels respectively.

Western Country Elevators Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 2,758,293 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 2,063,716, Oats 442,455, Barley 180,934, Flax 17,255 and Rye 53,938 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on July 19, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928:

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).-Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 639,213 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 640,325, Barley 1,896 and Flax 7,991 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 10,999 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 750,316 bushels. Wheat and Barley show increases of 752,807 and 3,173 bushels respectively while Oats shows a decrease of 5,664 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.-Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.-Stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).-Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,519,312 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 756,201, Oats 362,880, Barley 360,798 and Rye 60,374 while Flax shows a decrease of 20,941 bushels.






