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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 7, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 7, 1928, show a net decrease of 3,131,857 bushels. Stocks were as follows:- Wheat 27,264,579, Oats 2,773,686, Barley 1,855,051, Flax 543,752, and Rye 870,443, a total of 33,307,511 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 3,622,831 and 560,367 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in Barley of 641,598, Flax 12,650 and Rye 397,093 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show an increase of 1,055,837 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 513,057, Oats 13,433, Barley 388,231, Flax 76 and Rye 141,040 bushels.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 36,166 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 85,297, Oats 869 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 249,427 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 283,329 bushels and Barley 419, while Oats shows an increase of 34,321 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS:- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 209,363 bushels. Increases are noted in Barley of 314,400 and Rye 217,441 bushels, while Wheat shows a decrease of 138,148, Oats 64,408 and Flax 119,922 bushels.
