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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 14, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 14, 1928, show an increase of 6,595,342 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 31,009,690, Oats 2,828,052, Barley 3,929,786, Flax 557,220 and Rye 1,578,105, a total of 39,902,853 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 3,745,111, Oats 54,366, Barley 2,074,735, Flax 13,468 and Rye 707,662 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 7,122,559 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 5,534,704, Oats 83,822, Barley 1,066,336, Flax 7,842 and Rye 429,855 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 18,051 bushels. Oats and Flax show decreases of 8,392 and 18,154 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Wheat of 5,908, Barley 1,513 and Rye 1,074 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS: - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 428,529 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 502,206 bushels, while increases are noted in Oats of 72,429, Barley 247 and 1,001 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS: - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 2,609,686 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,409,797, Barley 908,793, Flax 18,472 and Rye 276,609 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 3,985 bushels.
