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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 28, 1928.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 28, 1928, show a net increase of 32,962,744 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 75,661,619, Oats 3,345,202, Barley 9,334,839, Flax 437,665 and Rye 2,439,669, a total of 91,218,994 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 30,075,395, Oats 546,944, Barley 2,250,051 and Rye 187,094 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 96,740 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 23,030,986 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 21,197,093, Oats 517,162, Barley 1,151,464, Flax 37,431 and Rye 127,836 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on September 21st, 1928, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1927.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 87,833. Increases are noted in Wheat of 84,794 and Rye 4,804 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 1,765 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,349,524 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,304,987, Oats 25,530 and Rye 20,135 bushels; while Barley shows a decrease of 1,128 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 872 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 5,890,876 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 5,969,181, Oats 116,183, Flax 6,888 and Rye 50,094 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 251,470 bushels.


PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN).- Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 77,411 bushels. Barley and Rye show increases of 405,514 and 28,250 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in Wheat of 266,427, Oats 16,600 and Flax 73,326 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST SEABOARD (CANADIAN GRAIN).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,171,269 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,016,415, Oats 148,969, Flax 59,978 and Rye 43,359, while Barley shows an increase of 97,462 bushels.

The total grain stocks at the St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports were as follows:- Wheat 1,937,916, Oats 576,999, Barley 211,059 and Flax 73,681, a total of 2,799,655 bushels bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S.GRAIN).- U. 




