

WORLD WHEAT SITUATION

August Exports Below Last Year's Level Total exports of wheat and wheat flour in terms of wheat from the <u>four traditional major exporters</u> during August 1971 have amounted to 121.3 million bushels, a decrease of

10 per cent from the 134.4 million bushels exported during the same month in 1970 but 6 per cent more than the ten-year (1960-69) average shipments for the same month of some 114.6 million bushels. As indicated in the accompanying table based on the Canadian crop year, exports from Canada were at a higher level this year than last while those from Australia, United States and Argentina were lower

Wheat Supplies of Four Major Exporters Below a Year Ago Total supplies of wheat remaining in Canada, Australia, United States and Argentina at September 1, 1971 for export and for carryover at the end of their respective crop years, amounted to 2,742.6 million bushels, 6 per cent less

than the 2,909.0 million at the same time a year ago. This decrease reflected smaller supplies for Canada, Australia and Argentina which more than offset an increase in United States. Supplies on or about September 1, 1971, in millions of bushels, were held as follows, with last year's comparable figures in brackets: Canada, 1,046.9 (1,139.0); Australia, 214.1 (363.7); United States, 1,474.5 (1,356.4); and Argentina, 7.1 (49.9).

CANADIAN SITUATION

Supplies Fourth
Highest on Record crop year are placed at 1,257.0 million bushels, consisting of the August 1 carryover of 749.5 million and the 1971 crop,

forecast on the basis of conditions at August 15, at 507.4 million bushels. Supplies of the size indicated are some 6 per cent less than the 1970-71 crop year total of 1,340.2 million and represent a sharp decrease in carryover stocks, which more than offset a substantial increase in production. Assuming realization of the August forecast of production and after making an allowance of 160.0 million bushels for anticipated domestic requirements, supplies available for export and for carryover during 1971-72 would amount to 1,097.0 million bushels, 7 per cent below the 1,184.6 million in 1970-71.

August Exports

Above Previous Year

August 1971 amounted to some 50.1 million bushels, compared with the August 1970 figure of 45.6 million. This year's

August wheat exports consisted of 48.5 million bushels of wheat in bulk, 26 thousand of seed and 1.5 million of flour in terms of wheat.

Subject to realization of current production and utilization estimates, the balance remaining on September 1, 1971 for export and for carryover, amounted to 1,046.9 million bushels, 8 per cent less than the September 1, 1970 total of 1,139.0 million.

August Forecast of
Production of Canada's
1971 Grain Crops

With the exception of winter wheat, oats for grain, spring rye and flaxseed, production of each of the major Canadian grains will be above last year's levels on the basis of yields indicated at August 15. Realization of the 1971

yield and production forecasts in the accompanying table is dependent on the existence of satisfactory weather conditions throughout the remainder of the growing and harvesting season. Dry weather and higher temperatures in the Prairie Provinces about mid-August hastened crop maturity. Earlier, especially in Manitoba and eastern Saskatchewan conditions had been wet and cool in some areas. As a result of the recent favourable weather harvesting operations were becoming general shortly after August 15, and favourable progress was reported.

Warm weather for most of August provided ideal grain harvesting conditions in Western Ontario although parts of the southwest suffered drought. Most of Quebec experienced favourable crop conditions but in the Maritimes the weather was wet. British Columbia received needed rains in August after a hot, dry period the previous month.

Canada's 1971 wheat crop, currently forecast at 507.4 million bushels is 53 per cent larger than last year's 331.5 million, but 17 per cent below the ten-year (1960-69) average of 609.5 million. The higher production results mainly from a 56 per cent increase in this year's seeded acreage in the Prairie Provinces. The average yield decreased slightly from 26.6 bushels in 1970 to 26.4 bushels per acre this year, but is well above the 1960-69 average of 22.0 bushels per acre.

The 1971 crop of <u>spring wheat</u>, forecast at 493.9 million bushels is being harvested from a seeded area of 18.9 million acres and yielding an indicated 26.1 bushels per acre. The 1970 spring wheat crop of 315.9 million bushels was produced on 12.1 million acres and yielded an average of 26.0 bushels per acre. The 1971 yield for Ontario's winter wheat crop is placed at 40.0 bushels per acre as compared with 43.9 bushels in 1970. With a 5 per cent decrease in acreage this year's production at 13.6 million bushels is below the 15.6 million in 1970.

In the Prairie Provinces, the 1971 wheat crop is forecast at 488.0 million bushels some 56 per cent above last year's crop of 312.5 million but 17 per cent below the ten-year average of 589.2 million. The forecasted average yield per seeded acre in the Prairie Provinces, on the basis of conditions at August 15, is 26.1 bushels per acre, with the Manitoba average 27.9 Saskatchewan 25.9 and Alberta 25.7

bushels per acre. Production in each of these provinces in millions of bushels, with last year's estimate in brackets, is as follows: Manitoba, 67.0 (30.5) Saskatchewan, 331.0 (210.0) and Alberta, 90.0 (72.0). Relatively small amounts of winter wheat are included in these forecasts for the Prairie Provinces.

The indicated production of <u>durum wheat</u>, which is included in the above forecast of spring wheat is 59.5 million bushels compared with last year's estimate of 80.9 million. Forecasts of 1971 production in each of the Prairie Provinces in millions of bushels, with last year's estimates in brackets are: Manitoba, 3.9 (2.4) Saskatchewan, 48.0 (66.0) and Alberta, 7.6 (12.5). The acreage seeded to this crop was 20 per cent smaller than in 1970. Yields per acre in 1971 with 1970 figures in brackets are: Manitoba, 26.0 (20.9) Saskatchewan, 24.0 (26.4) Alberta, 24.5 (27.8) and the Prairie Provinces, 24.2 (26.4).

The total visible supply of Canadian wheat at September 15 this Visible Supplies year, at 318.5 million bushels, represented a decrease of 24 per cent from the 1970 comparable total of 421.4 million and was 33 per cent less than the 478.1 million of 1969. The bulk of the supplies were in primary elevators, with visible supplies in this position amounting to 173.1 million bushels, 32 per cent less than the 1970 comparable total of 256.2 million, and 39 per cent below the 1969 figure of 282.6 million. Wheat stocks at interior terminals at September 15, 1971 totalled 6.9 million bushels below both the 11.8 million of a year ago and the 12.2 million of two years ago. The 14.9 million bushels "in transit rail" (western division) were below both the 1970 total of 20.4 million and the 1969 total of 24.1 million. Supplies at the Lakehead, totalling some 25.8 million bushels, were also lower than both last year's comparable level of 35.9 million and the 1969 figure of 52.8 million. Stocks "in transit lake", amounting to 10.1 million bushels were sharply above the 1970 level of 7.0 million and substantially more than the 1.1 million of two years ago. The 31.7 million bushels in Bay, Lake and Upper St. Lawrence ports were 8 per cent below the 34.7 million of a year ago and decreased by 16 per cent from the 37.9 million of two years ago. Supplies in Lower St. Lawrence and Maritime ports at September 15, 1971, at 42.0 million bushels, registered an increase over the 38.9 million at September 16, 1970 but were 3 per cent lower than the 43.1 million at the corresponding period in 1969. The 8.2 million bushels in West Coast ports (Vancouver-New Westminster, Prince Rupert and Victoria) were slightly above the 8.0 million at the comparable date in 1970 but below the 15.7 million of two years ago. Wheat supplies at the port of Churchill amounted to 1.5 million bushels compared with the 1970 total of 3.9 million and the 4.1 million of two years ago.

August 1971 Exports of Wheat and Flour Total 50.1 Million Bushels

Combined exports of wheat in bulk, seed wheat and wheat flour in terms of grain equivalent during August 1971 amounted to 50.1 million bushels, 11 per cent below the July 1971 total of 56.4 million but 40 per cent above

the ten-year (1960-69) average exports for the month of August of 35.8 million and 10 per cent more than the 45.6 million of August 1970.

Exports of wheat in bulk during August 1971 (as reported by the Canadian Grain Commission), amounted to 48.5 million bushels, registering a decrease of 11 per cent from the 54.8 million of July 1971, but was 8 per cent above the August 1970 figure of 44.8 million and 47 per cent more than the ten-year average for the month of August of 32.9 million. Exports of seed wheat during August 1971, based on Canadian Customs returns, amounted to 26 thousand bushels compared with the August 1970 total (adjusted to remove time lag) of 103 thousand bushels. Customs returns also indicate

that the equivalent of 1.5 million bushels of wheat was exported in the form of flour during August 1971, 3 per cent below the July 1971 figure of 1.6 million and 46 per cent smaller than the ten-year average for the month of August of 2.8 million but sharply above the August 1970 total (adjusted for time lag) of 0.7 million.

The People's Republic of China and the U.S.S.R. (Russia) were the major markets for wheat in bulk in August 1971 with shipments of 13.1 million bushels (27 per cent of total) and 9.9 million (20 per cent of total), respectively. India followed with shipments amounting to 4.5 million this year in contrast to 9.0 million in August 1970. Other markets for Canadian wheat in bulk during August 1971 with totals for the same month of the preceding crop year in brackets, were as follows, in millions of bushels: Japan, 3.4 (3.3); Italy, 3.0 (nil); Brazil, 2.6 (1.5); Syria, 2.3 (2.6); Belgium and Luxembourg, 1.7 (0.7); Netherlands, 1.6 (0.3); and South Korea, 1.2 (nil).

Exports of wheat flour by countries of consignment for August 1971 based on Customs data, are not available at this time.

Wheat Sale to

On September 23, 1971 the Canadian Wheat Board stated that
a sale involving a minimum of 3.7 million bushels
(100,000 long tons) of Canadian wheat to the Philippines
has been negotiated by the Canadian Wheat Board.

The sale, with a minimum value of approximately \$7 million, was negotiated in Manila with representatives of the Philippine Association of Flour Mills Ltd..

The contract calls for grades of No. 1 Canada Western Red Spring Wheat (with three protein levels) and No. 3 Northern Wheat. Shipments will begin in the next few weeks and continue until September 1972. All shipments will be made from West Coast ports.

The new sale was completed under terms involving credit made available by the Wheat Board and guaranteed by the Federal government.

Production Wheat flour production by Canadian mills during August 1971 amounted to 3,299,000 hundredweight, representing an increase of 3 per cent over the July 1971 output of 3,203,000 hundredweight and one per cent more than the ten-year (1960-69) average production for the month of August of 3,262,000 hundredweight but 3 per cent less than the August 1970 total of 3,383,000 hundredweight. Mills reporting operations during August 1971 had a total rated capacity of 168,000 hundredweight per 24-hour day and on the basis of a 26-day working period 75.7 per cent of this rated capacity was effective.

Wheat milled for flour during August 1971 amounted to 7,477,000 bushels, 3 per cent above the 7,277,000 bushels milled during the preceding month but 4 per cent below the 7,809,000 bushels milled during August 1970. Of the wheat milled for flour during August 1971 some 6,110,000 bushels were Western Canadian spring wheat (other than Durum) while the remainder consisted of Ontario winter wheat (839,000 bushels); Durum (375,000 bushels); and all other (153,000 bushels).

Exports According to preliminary Customs returns, exports of Canadian wheat flour during July 1971 amounted to the equivalent of 1,575,000 bushels (some 685,000 hundredweight of flour) 22 per cent less than the June 1971 exports of 2,026,000 bushels and 9 per cent lower than the adjusted July 1970 exports of 1,725,000 bushels. Flour shipments during July 1971 went to thirty-eight countries with exports to Cuba amounting to 1,029,000 bushels or 65 per cent of the July total. Other leading markets for Canadian wheat flour in terms of wheat during the month with shipments in thousands of bushels were as follows: Britain, 146; Leeward and Windward Islands, 96; Trinidad and Tobago, 68; Barbados, 45; United States, 36; Liberia, 34; and Nigeria, 26.

UNITED STATES SITUATION

Supplies Above Previous Year

1971-72 crop year are currently placed at 2,355.5 million bushels, 4 per cent more than the previous year's total of 2,263.1 million, reflecting an increase in production, which more than offset a 17 per cent decrease in carryover stocks. In addition, current crop year domestic supplies may be supplemented by imports of about 1 million bushels. Domestic disappearance during 1971-72 is estimated at about 780.0 million bushels, 2 per cent below the 794.8 million last year. After deducting anticipated domestic requirements for the current United States crop year, some 1,575.7 million remain available for export and for carryover, slightly above the 1,468.4 million in 1970-71.

1971 Wheat Crop Forecast at a Record 1,625 Million Bushels A report released on September 10, 1971 by the Crop Reporting Board of the United States Department of Agriculture stated that production of <u>all wheat</u> is forecast at a record high 1,625 million bushels, 25

million more than a month earlier and up 18 per cent from 1970 and 11 per cent from 1969. Prospective production of each of the three classes was above a month earlier. Changes between the September 1 forecast and the final estimates have averaged 17 million bushels, ranging from 3 million to 42 million. Yield of all wheat is forecast at a record 33.6 bushels, 2.5 bushels above last year and 2.9 bushels above 1969. Grain was expected to be harvested from 48.4 million acres, 9 per cent above 1970.

Production of winter wheat is forecast at 1,163 million bushels, up less than 1 per cent from the August 1 forecast of 1,156 million. The forecast is 4 per cent above last year's crop of 1,118 million and 1 per cent above the crop 2 years ago. Yields per acre in Washington, Oregon, and Idaho are at record high levels and above earlier expectations. Montana yield prospects were unchanged from a month earlier. Weather was nearly ideal for harvest over the four-State area and combining was drawing to a close on September 1. The winter wheat estimating period extends to September 1 in Montana, Idaho, Washington, and Oregon; for all other States estimates are carried forward from August 1.

<u>Durum wheat</u> production is forecast at 87.0 million bushels, up nearly 1 per cent from a month earlier and 72 per cent above the small 1970 crop but 18 per cent below the record large crop of 1969. The expected record yield per acre, at 32.4 bushels, stands 7.4 bushels above last year and 0.5 bushel above 2 years ago, the previous high. Yield per acre in North Dakota was unchanged from a month earlier but prospects improved in South Dakota, Montana, and Minnesota.

August weather was very favourable for harvest. Fifty-two per cent of North Dakota's crop was harvested by September 1 compared with 41 per cent last year and the average of 57 per cent. Combining in South Dakota was virtually complete by mid-August. In Montana harvest was nearing completion about a week ahead of last year. Harvesting in Minnesota was nearly complete.

Production of <u>spring wheat</u> other than durum, forecast at a record 376 million bushels, is 5 per cent above a month earlier and 79 per cent above the 1970 crop. The increase from a month ago was a result of improved yield prospects in all major producing States. The U.S. prospective yield of 29.8 bushels is a new record and compares with 23.8 last year and 27.5 in 1969, the previous high. August weather was favourable for maturing and harvesting the crop. In North Dakota, 71 per cent of the crop was combined, well ahead of last year's 64 per cent but somewhat behind average. Montana's crop was 80 per cent harvested by September 1, about a week ahead of average. Minnesota harvest was nearly complete. The South Dakota crop was nearly harvested by August 15.

Public Law 480
Sales Agreement for
Wheat/Wheat Flour
Signed with Lebanon

On August 31, 1971 the United States Department of Agriculture announced the signing of a Public Law 480 agreement with Lebanon providing for the sale of \$4.2 million worth (about 68,000 metric tons or 2,495,600 bushels) of wheat or wheat equivalent in flour. The signing took

place in Beirut.

On September 10, 1971 the United States Department of Agriculture announced the signing of a Public Law 480 agreement with Pakistan providing for the sale of \$40.8 million worth of U.S. wheat/wheat flour and soybean/cottonseed oil. The signing took place in Islamabad.

All of the \$30.3 million worth (about 500,000 metric tons or 18,350,000 bushels) of wheat or wheat equivalent in flour and the \$10.5 million worth (about 25,000 metric tons or 55,115,000 pounds) of soybean oil and/or cottonseed oil is for relief and rehabilitation in East Pakistan.

According to the Bureau of the Census, United States Department of Commerce, wheat flour production in the United States in July 1971 amounted to 20,216,000 hundredweight, averaging 1,001,000 hundredweight per working day, unchanged from the previous month and compared with 1,005,000 hundredweight in July 1970. Wheat flour mills during July operated at 91.8 per cent of capacity, compared with 95.3 per cent and 86.4 per cent, respectively, for the previous month and the same month a year ago. Flour mills in July 1971 ground 45,150,000 bushels of wheat as against 46,658,000 bushels the previous month and 44,700,000 bushels in July 1970.

ARGENTINE SITUATION

Supplies Lower Estimated tota than Previous Year (December-Nove

Estimated total supplies of wheat in Argentina for the 1970-71 (December-November) crop year amount to 183.7 million bushels, consisting of the December 1, 1970 carryover of 27.5 million blaced at 156.2 million. Indicated supplies for the current

bushels and the crop placed at 156.2 million. Indicated supplies for the current Argentine crop year, reflecting a substantial decline in production which more than offset a 76 per cent increase in carryover stocks, are about 33 per cent less than the 1969-70 total of 273.5 million bushels. After making an allowance of 150.0 million bushels for anticipated domestic requirements, an estimated 33.7 million are available for export and for carryover compared with 116.7 million in 1969-70.

Exports Down from Year Ago

Preliminary exports of wheat and wheat flour in terms of wheat equivalent during December 1970 — August 1971 amounted to 26.6 million bushels, considerably below the 66.9 million exported during the same months in 1969-70. The balance remaining on September 1, 1971 for export and for carryover was estimated at only 7.1 million bushels, substantially below the September 1, 1970 total of 49.9 million.

AUSTRALIAN SITUATION

Wheat Supplies Down from Last Year November) crop year amounted to 558.6 million bushels, compared with 654.2 million in 1969-70, reflecting decreases in both carryover stocks and production. The 1970 crop estimated at 293.5 million

in both carryover stocks and production. The 1970 crop estimated at 293.5 million bushels was sharply lower than the 387.5 million bushels harvested in 1969-70, and carryover stocks, at December 1, 1970, at 265.1 million bushels, were slightly less than the 266.7 million at the same time a year ago. After deducting some 101.4 million bushels for anticipated domestic requirements, an estimated 457.2 million are available for export and for carryover during 1970-71, some 19 per cent below the 562.1 million in 1969-70.

Combined exports of wheat as grain and wheat flour in terms of grain equivalent during the period December 1 — August 21 of the current Australian crop year amounted to 243.1 million bushels, 23 per cent above the 198.4 million exported during the corresponding nine months of the 1969-70 crop year. The balance remaining on August 22, 1971 for export and for carryover, at 214.1 million bushels, was 41 per cent below the comparable 1970 total of 353.7 million.

The following information relative to the Australian situation has been extracted from a report from Mr. R. Groundwater, Assistant Commercial Secretary for Canada, Melbourne, under date of September 29, 1971 and is reproduced with the permission of the Trade Commissioner Service, Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce.


The expected wheat production in Australia is placed at approximately 320 million bushels based on an acreage of 17.6 million. In Queensland production is estimated at 28 million bushels, New South Wales 100 million bushels, Victoria 60 million bushels, South Australia 55 million bushels, and West Australia 80 million bushels. Deliveries to the Australian Wheat Board as estimated by them are as follows: New South Wales 90 million bushels, Victoria 52 million, South Australia 50 million, West Australia 75 million, and Queensland 25 million bushels. It should be noted that the export manager for the Australian Wheat Board feels that the figures for New South Wales and Queensland are somewhat optimistic at this stage. Department of Primary Industry officials estimate total production approximately 300 million bushels.


Acreages estimated are as follows for Queensland 1.2 million, New South Wales 6.1 million, Victoria 2.8 million, South Australia 2.5 million and West Australia 5.0 million. Climatic conditions in 1971-72 season plays a major role in determining wheat production in Australia. Rains in September and October will be significant in determining final production figures in all states. In Queensland reasonably good seasonal conditions are being experienced and a good crop is expected but the acreage is down due to an early drought. In New South Wales conditions are somewhat variable and it is still difficult to give an accurate estimate of crop production. State officials have forecasts ranging from 50-100 million bushels. Rains in northern New South Wales have allowed planting to hard wheat vairieties, however, quality of the crop is yet unknown. Victoria and South Australia are experiencing excellent seasons. West Australia was dry until early September and it is believed that excellent rains received during late September will improve conditions.

CALENDAR OF WHEAT EVENTS

September

- Based on conditions at August 15, Canada's 1971 wheat crop was forecast at 507.4 million bushels, 53 per cent larger than last year's 331.5 million, but 17 per cent below the ten-year (1960-69) average of 609.5 million. The higher production results mainly from a 56 per cent increase in this year's seeded acreage in the Prairie Provinces. The average yield decreased slightly from 26.6 bushels in 1970 to 26.4 bushels per acre this year, but is well above the 1960-69 average of 22.0 bushels per acre.
- The Canadian Wheat Board announced the sale of 500,000 long tons of wheat to the People's Republic of China. This sale is in addition to the contract of 98,000,000 bushels negociated in Peking last October and, when completed will bring exports of Canadian wheat to China to a total of 117.6 million bushels in the present calendar year.
- According to a report received from Mr. R.A. Groundwater, Assistant Commercial Secretary for Canada, Melbourne, the expected wheat production in Australia for 1971-72 is placed at approximately 320 million bushels, based on an acreage of 17.6 million.
