## ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CAMADA, FEBRUARY, 1932.

Asbestos production in Canada declined 24.4 per cent to 7,706 tons in February as against 10,190 tons produced in January, according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

Quotations for magnesia and compressed sheet fibres in February ranged from \$70 to \$85 per ton; in January the price range was from \$100 to \$125 per ton. Shingle stocks recorded a decline in price of \$5 per ton in February. With the exception of spinning fibres quotations for the other grades of asbestos did not vary from the January level.

Employment in the asbestos industry continued at approximately the same level as in January.

Exports of asbestos were 20 per cent lower in February amounting to 7,747 tons as compared with 9,681 tons exported in January. In February the United States purchased 91 per cent of the Canadian exports of asbestos; Japan, Great Britain, Belgium, Germany, Australia and France furnished a market for the remainder. Exports of asbestos manufactures were valued at (5,917 in February.

Imports of asbestos packing into Canada totalled 17,510 pounds worth 59,060 in February; the United States supplied 52.2 per cent of these importations and Great Britain 47.8 per cent. Asbestos brake and clutch lining imports to a value of \$22,013 were received in February. Importations of other asbestos manufactures reached a value of \$14,764, of which the United States supplied 89.1 per cent, Great Britain 10.6 per cent and Germany 0.3 per cent.
