ASBESTOS PRODUCTION IN CANADA, SEPTEMBER, 1932.

Asbestos shipments by Canadian producers in September advanced 10.9 per cent to 11,001 tons as compared with the August total of 9,918 tons according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In September, 1931, the Canadian production amounted to 15,957 tons.

Quotations for asbestos showed little variation in September; the August prices prevailing for all grades except "shorts." For this grade the price range was from \$10 to \$12.50 per ton as compared with the August quotations of \$10 to \$14 per ton.

Customs' records show that the exports of Canadian asbestos during September reached a total of 9,954 tons as against 8,617 tons exported in the previous month. Shipments to the United States accounted for 85.1 per cent of the September exports.

Asbestos products imported into Canada Were valued at \$29,282; in August the imports were worth \$36,521. The value of asbestos brake and clutch lining imported in September was \$8,215, of which the United States supplied 80.7 per cent and Great Britain, 19.3 per cent. Receipts of asbestos packing amounted to 5,277 pounds worth \$2,166 as against 7,247 pounds at \$3,761 imported in August. Imports of other asbestos manufactures were appraised at \$18,901 and consisted of 63.4 per cent from the United States, 34.7 per cent from Great Britain, 1.4 per cent from Germany and 0.5 per cent from Austria.

In common with other important asbestos producing countries, the Rhodesian output of asbestos has shown a considerable decline in 1932; production during August was recorded at 1,044 tons or 26.1 per cent below the tonnage produced a year ago. During the eight months ending August, Rhodesia produced 9,209 tons, a decline of 56.8 per cent from the output in the corresponding period of 1931.
